Administrative Message

Happy New Year!

We had such an amazing December and loved all of the Leadership and individual classroom activities that promoted community, altruism and kindness. Tofield School and Tofield Community came together in so many promising and encouraging ways. We are very proud of our collective efforts to engage with Seniors, CW Sears, Our First Responders, The Food Bank and Food Hamper efforts, SADD Canada, Snow Removal for those in need, 1st Annual pancake breakfast and just general acts of kindness.

As you are likely aware, the budget situation for many school divisions has resulted in the need to take steps to address the shortfalls.

For the second semester, Tofield School will reduce staffing by one full time equivalent teacher. Although our enrollment is strong (close to 400 students), it is below what we projected when budgets were prepared last spring. So, adjustments have to be made. We are also pleased that the employee leaving is able to take on a different position within Battle River School Division due to a retirement at another school.

Since September 30th, Tofield School has accepted 40 NEW registrations and we are very encouraged about this trend. We know that we have a very strong and committed staff and will ensure that student learning remains our top priority.

Our Exam Week went incredibly well and students and staff were all well prepared to achieve great results. Semester 2 starts on February 3rd and we are very excited about offering Esthetics and Wellness Classes along with our other incredible elective choices. Mr. Kendall and I will be teaching a bit more in the 2nd semester and want to remind everyone to call in for appointments, as we do not want anyone to have to wait an inordinate amount of time for our attention.

Let's all work together to have an amazing second half of the year!

Selected students from Tofield School grades 5 to 8 are busy preparing for the eight annual Math League competition. The competition is on **Tuesday, February 18th / 2020.**

Over 1 million students from the United States and Canada participate in Math League Contest each year. Every contest has questions from different areas of mathematics. The goal is to encourage student interest and confidence in mathematics through solving *worthwhile* problems. Many students first develop an interest in mathematics through problem-solving activities such as these contests. Schools compete in provincial wide or national league competitions.

5th and 6th Grade Contests

Math League's 4th and 5th grade contests can add interest and excitement to any mathematics program. These are some of the first math contests many students will compete in--and the most fun with math they've ever had! All of the questions cover basic 4th and 5th grade topics, including: properties of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division, time and calendar questions, shapes, perimeter, money, basic ratio and percent, rounding numbers, remainders, integers, and more. These contests challenge students to show their understanding of basic principles through numerical and word problems that encourage an open, flexible approach to problem solving. These contests are provided for intra school competition, and come with certificates of merit for your school's high scoring students.

Contest Format: Each contest consists of 30 multiple-choice questions that you can do in 30 minutes. On each 3-page contest, the questions on the 1st page are generally straightforward, those on the 2nd page are moderate in difficulty, and those on the 3rd page are more difficult. The 4th and 5th grade contests are for use in our school or district. Since results are not used for inter school comparisons, we do not enclose a score report form.

7th, and 8th Grade Contests

Math League's 7th, and 8th grade contests challenge students and schools in inter school league competitions. Students in each league compete for the highest scores, while schools compete for the highest team score: the total of the top 5 scores in each school. Each contest's questions cover material appropriate to each grade level. Questions may cover: basic topics, plus exponents, fractions, reciprocals, decimals, rates, ratios, percents, angle measurement, perimeter, area, circumference, basic roots, patterns, sequences, integers, triangles and right triangles, and other topics, depending on the grade level. Detailed solution sheets demonstrate the methods used to solve each problem. These contests encourage a variety of problem-solving skills and methods, to improve students' abilities and understanding of mathematical connections, while having fun!

Contest Format: Each contest consists of 40 multiple-choice questions that you can do in 30 minutes. On each 3-page contest, the questions on the 1st page are generally straightforward, those on the 2nd page are moderate in difficulty, and those on the 3rd page are more difficult. There is a 7th and 8th Grade Score Report sent to schools in each league after the contest.
