GR. 5 & 6 MINDFUL SCHOOLS

We are learning how to cope with stress/anxiety and regulate our bodies and emotions. We are practicing increasing our attention through Mindfulness practices like listening.

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION GR. 7-12 WELLNESS BREAKS

We are learning ways to support our mental health through relaxation and co-regulation. We are working with using a Hoberman's Sphere to guide our breathing.









GR. 9 HIGH SCHOOL & MENTAL HEALTH

We are learning about mental health, stigma, mental disorders, coping strategies, and support networks. This understanding of mental health will help to empower students to act as informed advocates for themselves and their peers.

TOFIELD SCHOOL STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. Students must not loiter in the hallways during class time and at lunch. Hallways must be kept clear.
 - a. Grades 5 8 students eat in their **homerooms** for the first half of lunch hour.
 - b. Students in Grades 7-8 <u>must have a signed note from their parents</u> in order to leave the school grounds during the lunch hour.
 - c. Grades 9-12 students are permitted to leave the school during lunch break or they can eat their lunch in either the student lounge, at a flex table or in a classroom in the high school hallway.
 - d. The second half of lunch hour is spent in the gym, outside, or in classrooms.
 - e. The concession will be open during the first half of lunch.
- 2. Body contact, contact sport and roughhousing is not permitted at any time.
- 3. Skateboards, roller blades, scooters, and heelies are not to be used on school property.
- 4. Food and drink should be consumed at breaks. During class time, the consumption of food and drink is, as needed by the student, at the discretion of the teacher.
- 5. Clean footwear must be worn in the school and students must wear non-marking indoor shoes in the gym.
- 6. Students are expected to attend, be on time, and be prepared for all classes.
- 7. All students must have parental permission and sign out when leaving the school during the day for appointments and will sign in when returning from appointments.
- 8. Students will obey all safety rules of the school.
- 9. The use of profane language is prohibited on school property and on school buses.
- 10. Students will be respectful to all staff members and respect school property.
- 11. Students are required to ask permission from the teacher when leaving the classroom during instructional time.
- 12. Students will adhere to the Tofield School Digital Device Policy (Appendix A in the Tofield School Handbook).
- 13. Students will adhere to the Tofield School Appropriate Dress Policy (Appendix F in the Tofield School Handbook).
- 14. **Use, possession, and/or distribution** of substances such as tobacco products, vapes, alcohol, cannabis, and any illegal drugs in the school and on school property is strictly prohibited. Students are not permitted to use any of the aforementioned substances on school property or within sight of the school. Students using, possessing, distributing, and/or under the influence of prohibited substances while at school will face disciplinary action.
- 15. To be eligible to park in student parking lot, students must complete a Parking Lot Agreement form. Student drivers are expected to follow traffic laws and display etiquette when using the parking lot.

The Tofield School Code of Conduct is within the framework of Battle River School Division Administrative Procedure 360: Student Code of Conduct.

1. Behavioural Expectations

- 1.1 Work Ethics
 - 1.1.1 Students must attend school regularly and punctually.
 - 1.1.2 Students will complete all assignments and homework.
 - 1.1.3 Students will work to the best of their ability.
 - 1.1.4 Students will continually strive for excellence in all endeavors.
- 1.2 Respect for Self and Others
 - 1.2.1 Students will dress appropriately and use appropriate language and deportment. 1.2.2 Students will respect the diversity, safety, privacy, and wellbeing of all.
 - 1.2.3 Students will adhere to this Code of Conduct, as it relates to classmates, school mates and school staff, within the school building, during school hours, at school functions and beyond school hours both in person and when using electronic means of communication.
- 1.3 Respect for Authority
 - 1.3.1 Students will adhere to all Board and school policies and procedures.
 - 1.3.2 Students will cooperate fully with everyone authorized by the Division to provide educational programs and services.
 - 1.3.3 Students will conduct themselves with respect for legal authority.
- 1.4 Respect for Property
 - 1.4.1 Students will respect school property.
 - 1.4.2 Students will respect the property of others.

Recommendations Regarding Consequences for Major Offenses

Suspension, with the possibility of expulsion, is an appropriate consequence for:

- I. Physical or emotional abuse, violence, assault, and threats to student/staff safety (including possession of weapons);
 - II. Possession and/or use of prohibited drugs and/or alcohol;
 - III. Open defiance and/or opposition to authority;
 - IV. Sexual and \ or other harassment of other students;
 - V. Theft;
 - VI. Vandalism;
 - VII. Bullying; and
 - VIII. Other conduct injurious to the moral tone of the school.
