Skills Alberta 2022 Competition and Programming Update

Competition season is just around the corner, and we know you have been patiently awaiting updates on the format for this year's competitions and our other programs. We have spent the last few weeks working collaboratively with school boards, teachers, volunteer base, and suppliers to figure out the best course of action for all our stakeholders.

Due to restrictions on travel for many school boards in Alberta, and to ensure that our secondary competitions are as inclusive as possible, they will once again be hosted virtually in-school. In an effort to streamline the delivery of competitions and respect the availability of resources and capacity, the Regional and Provincial competitions will be combined into the free **2022 Secondary Skills Canada Alberta Virtual Competition**, where one day competitions for each contest area will be held **April 11 – 14**, **2022**. Registration will open on **January 26**, **2022**. Post-Secondary competitions will still be hosted in-person at the 2022 Post-Secondary Provincial Skills Canada Competition at the Edmonton EXPO Centre on May 4 & 5, 2022.

There will be a virtual Skills Canada Alberta Awards Ceremony for both events on **May 6**, **2022**, at **6:30 p.m.** For competitions that progress onto the 2022 Skills Canada National Competition, all secondary students will be competing virtually from **May 16-28**, **2022**. More details to come later.

As ever, we are committed to putting all our time and energy into creating an extraordinary experience for all competitors.

As there will be no school field trips or Skill City at the 2022 Provincial Skills Canada Competition, we will continue to provide other hands-on career exploration experiences for your students, including:

- Try-A-Trade® Takeout (order form to open March 7)
- A month-long Girls Exploring Trades and Technologies program in March, in celebration of International Women's Month (registration to open February 2)

Even though our programs continue to evolve and adapt to our province's circumstances, one thing remains the same – our goal of inspiring, developing, and elevating Alberta's skilled youth. We thank you for your patience and for your continued support and involvement with Skills Canada Alberta.


