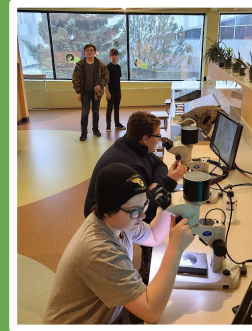

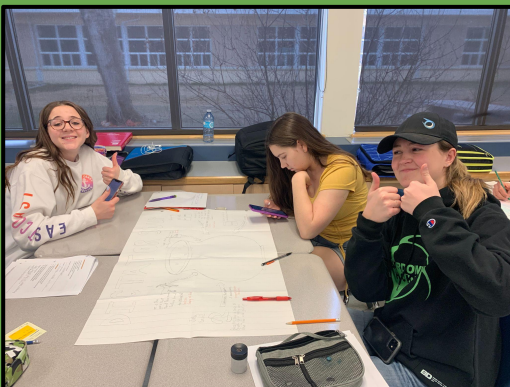

Family School Liaison Workers (FSLWs)

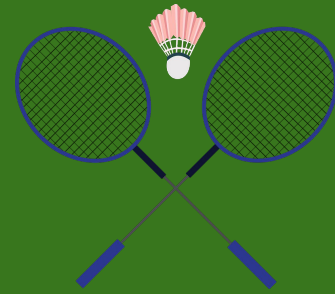

Stand Out with Current Resume Tips

Did you know?
80% of resumes are rejected in less than 11 seconds?



Focus on the following to create an impressive resume:

- ❖ **One page maximum** as a youth; two to three pages if you have more experience
- ❖ **Top 1/3** of your resume is prime real estate - use it wisely
- ❖ **Best fonts** include arial, tahoma, and calibri
- ❖ **Font sizes:** your name 16-20; headings 12-14; & body 10-12
- ❖ **Tailor** your resume to the job posting by incorporating keywords and skills
- ❖ **Write out words**, e.g. Jan 2022 should be January 2022
- ❖ **Don't mess with the margins** - white space is a good thing
- ❖ Showcase your best **NOT** all
- ❖ Let your **personality** shine!

Final Tidbits for Funding Your Education

Looking for **Alberta student loans and grants?** Apply at least two months before you plan to attend post-secondary and watch your email for updates to your application.



Apply for the **Alexander Rutherford Scholarship**. Your hard work during high school may pay off with money. You can apply once you have completed high school and been accepted to a qualifying post-secondary program. **This scholarship is available at any age, so whether you go to post-secondary immediately or years down the road, you may qualify.** The new form is open each year in August.

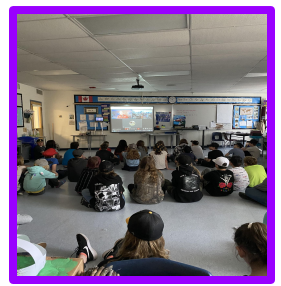

SNOW BIRD #9 VISITS GRADE 6 ON GOOGLE MEET

They break off and do separate tricks. Pilot number 1 is the leader. Every other pilot follows him. They have to practice a lot and practice over water to practice all terrains. 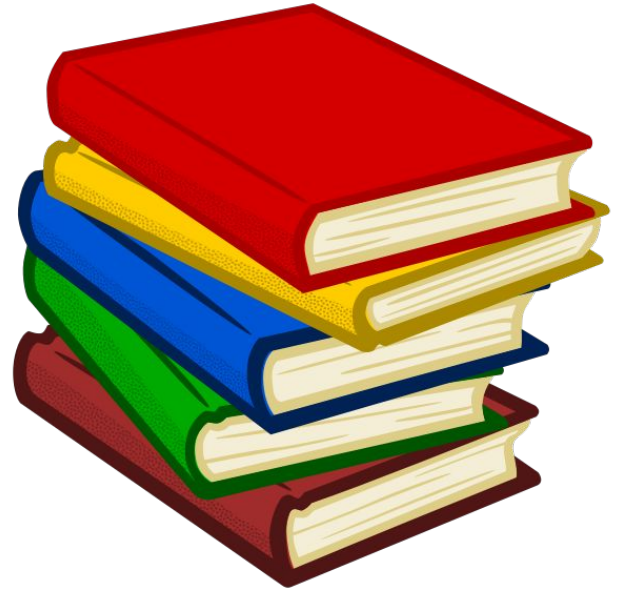
Snowbird #9 Zooms into a Google Meet with Tofield School!

Tofield school had an amazing opportunity May 4 2022, to talk and ask questions with Stu, snowbird #9. Stu about being a member of the team. He told us what it was like to be where he is now, like going through school, university, military school at 17 for 4 years and then becoming a pilot. Stu just joined the snowbirds summer of 2021 and he enjoys it very much. Stu grew up outside of Calgary and loves our province. Stu gave inspiring quotes to us about being a pilot like, “ It’s very tricky and challenging but it was rewarding and worth it.” The kids were very encouraged when they heard that. One thing he said that when you are flying, you look at the leader, never the person beside you. The longest Stu has flown was 8 hours in the Hornet. The Hornet was the plane he had some of the best memories in. One memory was he went as high as he could, which was 48 000ft in the air. If he had gone any higher he would’ve needed astronaut boots. They usually start at 7:40am and usually end by 12:50. He said he dreamed of being a snowbird since he was a child and tells the same thing to students he teaches. “ Study hard and stay in school, to watch your dreams come true!” is what he said to his students. This was a great opportunity for grade 6 and we’d love to have him come back!
